The stock market to-day was subject to several reactionary influences. Profit taking was largely indulged in and London houses turned sellers. The bears renewed operations on rumors of a renewal of ratecuting and rumors of a large bank defalcation obtained circulation prior to an explanation made by the Chemical Bank of a loss of about \$393,000 suffered on account of bad loans made by the cashier. The continued prostration of telegraph wires between here and Boston contributed to a restriction of activity. In spite of these circumstances there were few important reactions in prices. Exceptional strength was shown by New York Central, Northern Pacific preferred, Union Pacific preferred, Western Union and others. Offerings were absorbed readily. Jersey Central rose sharply, and the market closed irregularly, but fairly steady. In Government bonds the new 4's were offered & lower. Rallway bonds were generally strong.

McIntyre & Wardwell (John J. Dixon) received the following despatch to-day from New York:

The stock market developed further irregularity and heaviness to-day. There was further falling off in outside demand for bonds as well as stocks, and character of trading was in the main a repetition of yesterday's, with selling apparently better than buring. Large operators continued reducing their holdings and securing profits and worked off a good deal under cover of strength of specialties, particularly of New York Central, Union Pacific, Outarlo & Western, Baltimore Ohio, Chesapeake & Ohio, and Lonisville & Nashville, which again felt the influence of clique operations. A good deal of selling was credited to Messrs. Keene and Connor, and gossip says these operators are carrying a smaller amount of stocks than for some time.
