

NO COMPROMISE

Effort to Settle Harden-Von Moltke Case Out of Court Fails.

Berlin, Dec. 21. — The judges suspended the Harden-Von Moltke trial for 45 minutes today, in order to give the principals an opportunity again to talk over terms of compromise. The effort was without result.

The taking of testimony was then continued. The public and the newspaper representatives are still excluded. Prince Philip Zu Eulenburg has completely recovered from the fainting spell which came upon him while he was being cross-examined yesterday, and today he appeared at court, ready to testify again should this be desirable. Count Kuno Von Moltke and Frau Von Eulenburg, his divorced wife, were re-examined today.
