"The investigation confirms the general opinion that there is a considerable shortage of labor in these plants. This is naturally particularly felt in connection with skilled labor, such as a almost equal need is felt for general laborars," says the report as handed to the press by Dr. Abbott.

"The shortage of labor has given rise to many minor labor troubles, and a constant shifting of men from one establishment to another. These conditions naturally operate to lessen the production of munitions. It would be a great help if patriotic workmen could fully understand this and so cooperate with the manufacturers as to increase the cutput of munitions to the highest possible point. 
