UNEASINESS IS APPARENT Unfavorable Crop Reports and Untimely Opening of Presidential Campaign are Troubling the Market.

(N. Y. Journal of Commerce.) Cheap money has not counteracted the effect of unfavorable crop reports and the troubling of the political waters. The floor trader, of course, does not bother about these things. So long as speculation is animated he can snatch fractions. But the leading banking institutions are perturbed more than is generally known over the untimely opening of the Presidential campaign. They had hoped that the various steps taken by the Treasury to insure easy money would enable them to reduce their security holdings at a much better figure than now seems possible. Moreover, the continued prosecution of the Standard Oil Company and the authoritative statement that the government is confident of a victory in its fight to dissolve that trust have not tended to allay anxiety over Washington's attitude. The peace congress was regarded as of academic but not practical helplessness to securities. The heavy borrowing by Germany and Prussia did not materially affect either foreign or home money markets, neither was much attention paid to the British budget, although later developments disclose that the Liberal government's income tax proposals have hurt consols and have aroused the ire of large investors. The Southern seismic disturbances created apprehension, but Wall Street has become so immune to calamities and prices are already so low that the market did not suffer appreciably.
