THE Forty-fourth Session of the Toronto School of Medicine will be opened on Friday, October 1st, 1886, when the Introductory Lecture will be delivered, at 4 p.m., in the large Lecture Room, by Dr. McFarlane. The regular Lectures of the Winter Session will be commenced October 2nd, at hours named in time table, and will be continued for six months.

On account of the greatly increasing numbers of students during the last few years, it has been found necessary to make frequent additions to the school building, and yearly alterations in the internal arrangements. It has been the desire of the Faculty to afford the greatest possible facilities for practical instruction in all departments. The present building includes the following rooms:—One large Lecture Room, capable of seating 350 persons; one smaller Lecture Room, with capacity for 150; one large Dissecting Room, well lighted and well equipped; one Dissecting Room for prosectors; one Dissecting Room for special demonstra-
