STORM AND FLOOD TAKE HEAVY TOLL IN U.S.

TORNADO-SWEPT SOUTH REPORTS OVER 50 KILLED

Dam Bursts; Trapping Tea Men in Tunnel

Twister Strikes Louisiana, Arkansas, and Missouri, Destroying Many Communities

A LATE November tornado, travelling a zig-zag path through portions of Louisiana, Arkansas and Missouri, turned Thanksgiving Day into a day of sorrow for hundreds of persons.

More than fifty were killed, and probably several hundred injured, as the twister tore through several small communities, mowing down scores of homes and disrupting communication. Damage was estimated at several hundred thousand dollars.

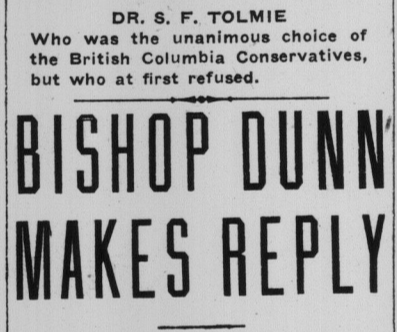
The storm, apparently an intensification of a disturbance which has been pushing eastward from the Pacific coast, struck with its greatest fury in Central Arkansas, and then moved north through the centre of the state into Missouri, where it brought death and destruction to several widely scattered communities. An off-shoot also caused numerous deaths and considerable damage in Louisiana. Heavy rains accompanied the twister.

Children of London Show Improvement

LONDON, Nov. 26.—Sir George Newman, in his report for 1925, as chief medical officer of the Board of Education, reveals the fact that post-war children are gaining in height and weight, and that the slums show the greatest improvement. On the other hand, the report reveals that when entering school a larger proportion of children are still under-nourished and bear the marks of industrial environment.
