BUSY TIME AT SAND POINT SATURDAY

Minnedosa and Montcalm Expected to Arrive and Metagama to Sail

Indications point to a busy day at Sand Point tomorrow. The Canadian Pacific steamer Minnedosa is expected to arrive off Partridge Island at 8 o'clock this evening and the passengers will be landed early tomorrow morning. The Montcalm, of the same line, will reach port tomorrow morning about 10 o'clock and it was hoped

that all the passengers of that vessel would be landed by evening. The Metagama is expected to sail tomorrow at 2:30 o'clock. She will take 85 cabin and 367 third-class passengers.
