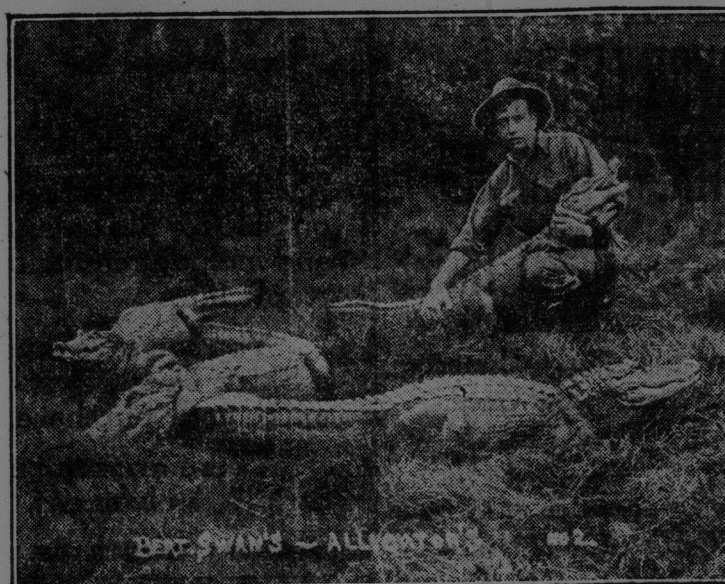

Coakley to Coach.

Andy Coakley, the old major league pitcher, who returned to Columbia last spring as baseball coach, yesterday signed a three-year contract to handle the Blue and White diamond team.

Coakley has coached Columbia for a number of years. In 1916 he developed his best aggregation, which, captained by Robert W. Watt, now graduate manager of athletics, made an impressive record in the east and laid claim to the eastern college championship. In 1918 and 1919 Coakley was displaced by Fred Dawson, the latter taking charge of baseball and basketball in addition to football. When Dawson resigned last year because of illness, Coakley was engaged immediately as baseball coach and coached the nine last spring.

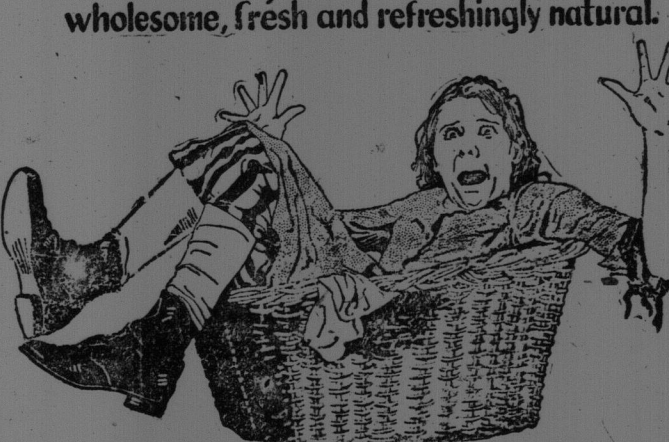

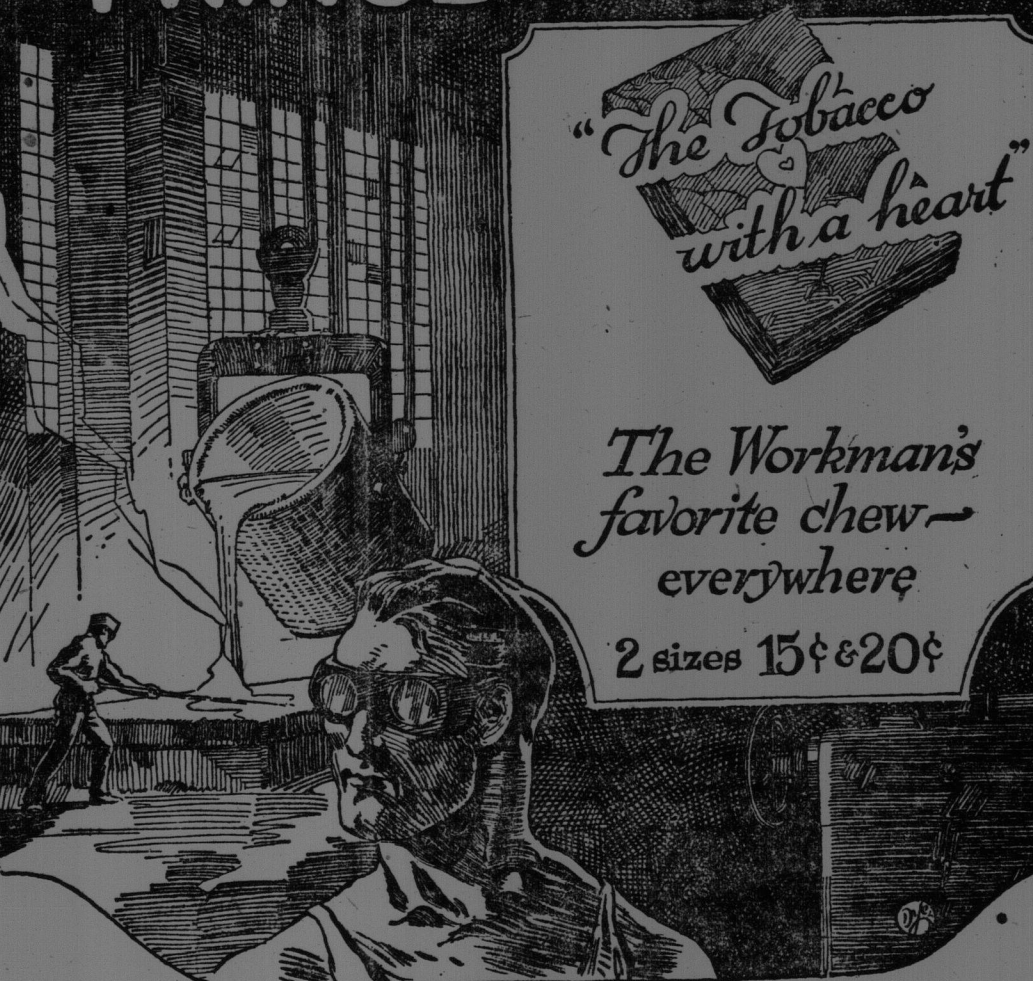
