Loyalist Day

Yesterday was observed in this city, the 136th anniversary of the landing of the Loyalists, although there was no very elaborate ceremony. Mention of the anniversary was made in the churches. Rev. Canon R. A. Armstrong, in Trinity church, told of the glorious traditions of the indomitable founders of the city, in two sermons.

Not only is May 18 the anniversary of the landing of the Loyalists, 10,000 in number, in St. John, but two years later it was incorporated by the people who founded it, being the first overseas city in the empire to receive a charter. It was not until fifty years afterwards that the second city in Canada was granted a charter.

The public schools have a holiday today in honor of the founding of St. John in 1783.

Tramways Wages Award. Montreal, May 18.—The award of the board of arbitration in the Montreal Tramways case, was announced to the employees on Saturday. The rank and file regard the award as favorable, and more than eighty per cent. voted for its acceptance. The award is to go into effect on July 1. Increases run from six to twelve cents an hour, for those paid by the hour, and from twenty per cent.

German War Losses.

Paris, May 19.—(Havas Agency)—German war losses up to last April 30 were 2,000,460 dead, 4,907,028 wounded, and 615,922 missing, according to figures published in Berlin.
