REPORTED RESIGNATION

OF CHAIRMAN OF HARBOR
COMMISSION IN MONTREAL

Montreal, Oct. 23.—It is learned that
Major George Washington Stephens, chair-
man of the Harbor Commission, has
tendered his resignation to the minister
of marine, Hon. J. D. Hason.

Major Stephens refused to make any
statement. It is understood that the re-
signation is in the hands of the minister
of marine.

The announcement of his resignation
came as a surprise to all who are inter-
ested in the port of Montreal. Should
the resignation be accepted, it is prob-
able that it will take effect at practi-
cally the same time as those of C. C. Bal-
lantine and L. E. Geoffrion; the two other
commissioners, whose resignations were ac-
cepted by Hon. Mr. Hason some time ago.
