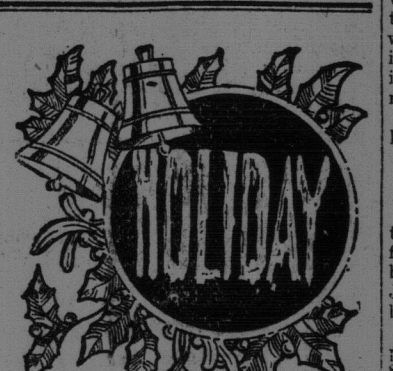

### VALUABLE GEM IS CLEVERLY STOLEN

London, Dec. 26.—The headmaster of one of the St. Pancras schools of the London county council has proposed a useful and practical addition to its teaching. He proposes that the boys should be taught cubbing during school hours.

Last year 100 pairs of boots were supplied to children attending this school, and it would be a benefit to the children to be able to do the repairing themselves. Both the headmaster and the assistant master have had experience in the boot-making trade, and could teach its rudiments.

The education committee has been recommended to approve of the scheme, and to vote £1 towards the necessary outfit for tools, and a private subscription of 20s. has also been received. If this scheme succeeds, it is proposed to extend it to other of the London county council schools, as being a practical and educative branch of teaching.
