


INCENDIARY ATTEMPTS OF REBELS IN NICARAGUA LEAD TO THE LANDING OF AMERICAN MARINES



Managua, Nicaragua, Aug. 25—American marines have landed on both the east and west coasts to protect the lives and property of American citizens and foreigners. While the capital itself is considered safe for the present, there have been incendiary attempts at Bluefields and other points. Several hundred federal troops of the garrison of Leon were massacred by the revolutionists. The United States gunboat Annapolis is stationed on the west coast, while the protected cruiser Tacoma is on the east coast.

LA MARQUISE de FONTENAY

Lord Say and Sele, who has just been appointed to the office of comptroller of King George's household, is the eighteenth baron of his line, and the head of the historic House of Finesse, pronounced "Kynes". In still existing records of the reign of William the Conqueror it is set forth that he conferred on one of his principal lieutenants, John de Finesse, the office of count of the sea coasts, for himself and his heirs for ever.

The Lords de Finesse were among the barons whose names figure in the Magna Charta, and were even in those days regarded as of the most illustrious ancestry, since they were descended from that Count of Finesse, who married Goda, sister of King Edward the Confessor. This count and Countess de Finesse were known among the forebears of Godfrey de Bouillon, the Crusader King of Jerusalem. The original Barony of Say and Sele came into the Finesse family through the marriage of Lady Joan of that ilk to her line to William Lord Finesse, hereditary warden of the Cinque Ports and tenth in descent from the Kinan and companion of William the Conqueror.
