RUSSIAN REVOLTS. FURTHER CONFLICTS BETWEEN THE PEASANTS AND MILITARY.

The Peasants Say They Will Not Relapse into Serfdom, they Prefer to be Fighting—Nine Thousand Troops Operating Against Them. BY TELEGRAPH TO THE GAZETTE: LONDON, Oct. 29.—The Telegraph's St. Petersburg correspondent says: The Minister of the Interior has received a telegram containing alarming accounts of the peasant revolts in the Kharov and Yekaterinburg districts of the Russian Empire. The Minister declares that he will not relax his efforts, preferring to die fighting.
