SLIGHT BLAZE IN WEST END NICKEL. Roll of Films Caught Fire from Electric Wiring—Department Called Out. But Were Not Needed.

The West End Nickel, which is located in the old Carleton City Hall, was temporarily closed last evening as a result of a fire. The management, however, states that the usual programme will be put on tonight.

The fire occurred at about 9 o'clock, the rolls of films in the machine operator's booth becoming ignited, presumably from the electric wires running to the machine. The films were composed of celluloid and blazed up quickly, scorching the walls of the booth. The operator, Charles Clark, at once stopped out and requested the spectators to leave the building to avoid any accidents.

An alarm from box 114 called out the West Side fire department, but their services were not required, a few buckets of water putting out the blaze. There were about a hundred people present when the accident occurred. All danger was over in a couple of minutes.
