DUG UP SEGRETLY

IN \$30,000 SUIT

Insurance Company's Doctors Performed Autopsy in Gemetery

NIAGARA, FALL, April 15.—A weird disinterment scene in which doctors slipped into Riverdale Cemetery and took up the body of State Senator Stanislaus P. Franchot before it had been in the grave an hour was brought to light here.


