Yong Daley was gradually becoming numb from the cold water, when the cry for help caught the ear of James Rogers, who was at work at the forward hatch.

The tug Waring happened to be towing a scow up the harbor at the time when Captain McLean heard the cry, a man overboard, he dropped his tow and made for the spot, and when he got there Rogers was keeping Daley's head above water.

The tug landed the men at the Market wharf and the ambulance was sent for to take Yong Daley to his home at Fort Howe.
