COAL FROM OIL

After twelve years of research, a German professor of Heidelburg, has perfected a method of converting coal into oil, an average of half a ton of oil being obtained from one ton of coal. The application of the method, he remarks, will enable countries rich in coal to cover their own needs in benzine, machine oil and lubricating oil from their own coal.
