

### Day Students Department Under Study

(CUP)—The day-students at Sir George Williams College are still waiting for the Faculty's decision regarding the recommendations made by the 4-man Department Committee. Until their decision has been handed down and the new department regulations debated on by the Students' Undergraduate Society they will not be in force.

The appointment of this department committee was the result of a request made by the Faculty to the SUS that they do something about the general conditions in the college, especially concerning the rowdyism and untidiness of the joint men and women's common room.

The committee's recommendations consisted of a list of punishable offences and a request for certain powers to deal with those

people creating any of these offences.

The Faculty at present are in processing amending and making suggestions regarding these rules proposed by the Department Committee and their final decision is expected at the end of the week.

The attitude of the college newspaper 'The Georgian', towards these proposed regulations is concern over the fact that they were compelled to put the cart before the horse, in having to inform the students that these recommendations had gone to the Faculty before being able to tell the students what was going on, and present the case to them.


