Dear Sir:-

With further reference to my letter dated Jan 28 1935 replying to your letter #23114-3 of Jan 21st, I may say that the Indians are now very anxious to obtain payment for their work, and as they know that the Indians of Muscowpetung Band went to work on the roads and dams under precisely the same conditions as themselves and have received payment they feel that they are being discriminated against and cannot understand the Department attitude, although I have explained to them that I proceeded without authority, they simply refer to the Muscow petung case.

They are also aware that they have larger surplus interest funds than any other Band on this Agency

I am enclosing herewith a copy of a letter sent to Mr. Murison from the Band

I sincerely hope that the Department will accede to their request and forward the amount asked for as soon as it is convenient
