

Ottawa, 18th July, 1899-

Sir,

I have been directed to request you to re-trace the boundary lines of the Fisher's Grant Indian Reserves, near Pictou, N.S.

A copy of a plan , shewing these Reserves, is enclosed herewith, for your information, and I have to request you to communicate with the Rev.R.McDonald, Indian Agent, Museka, Pictou, Co., who will give you any further information you may require.

The lines where woods occur, are to be well cut out, and every tree adjacent to them, properly blazed.

All the corners and angles, and one or more points on long lines, are to be marked with substantial wooden posts of the most durable wood in the locality. The posts are to be squared, to be marked I.R., and to be surrounded with a mound of stones.

Please return the Plan herewith, or a Plan of the Reserves, shewing thereon the lines you have rum, and the posts and mounds planted, together with a report of your work.

You will be allowed for your services at current rates. You should employ such assistance as you may require. Please return Vouchers for all expenditures.
