

Mr. Curran's improvements reported that the only claims he found on the Reserve in question were near the South East corner - one containing 10 acres ploughed, no fence, the other containing about 5 acres fenced and under crop; that there was an old dilapidated building which had he thought been used as a mill by the Mission, but must have been abandoned long ago and that it was of no value. Mr. Simpson subsequently stated in a letter to the Assistant Indian Commissioner for the North West Territories that he could not place any value on the old building which had been a mill, that when he made the survey it was in a very dilapidated condition
