

"passed property which it  
 purported to bequeath. The  
 law in force at the date of  
 her death (see 43. V.C. 2852)  
 made provision respecting  
 the devolution of lands in  
 descent belonging to married  
 Indians and of their goods  
 and chattels which the said  
 Acts were inconsistent with  
 a power to dispose of such  
 property by will. Later  
 Acts granted power to a  
 limited extent and subject  
 to the approval of the will  
 by the Council of the Board  
 and by the Superintendent Council.  
 The fact that the death of  
 Mrs. Kato-goo took place  
 before
