I beg to acknowledge receipt of your favour of the 5th inst.,  
and enclosures, being a number of applications for cancellation  
and registrations forwarded by Indian Agent Harper Reed.

All cancellations have been attended to and all trap-lines  
covered are now cancelled. The new applications have been  
entered on the maps at this office and the applications for-  
warded to Mr. Reed for his signature, along with an individual  
sketch showing the location of the trap-line.

There can be no earthly reasons why these trap-lines should  
not be registered as submitted.

In order to expedite registration of trap-lines I would be very  
pleased if Mr. Reed would deal direct with the Constables or  
Game Wardens concerned. The sending of all these applications  
to your office, thence to Prince George, and returning same to  
Telegraph Creek, all causes untold delays. I do not expect  
these applications to reach this office again until next May  
or June.

Your co-operation in this matter will be highly appreciated.
