August.—At the time of this writing, great excitement prevails in England, respecting the disease which has resulted in the death of great numbers of cattle. It is to be hoped that the disease will not reach this country. The symptoms and course of the disease are thus described by the Medicul Times:—"The cow, previously quite healthy, is suddenly seized with trembling or rigors; in an hour or two purging of thin fœcal matter occurs, soon followed by purging of a thin, watery, brown, serous fluid, sometimes accompanied with a little blood. Of course, the milk is at once suppressed. Soon after a serous discharge takes place from the nose, and the mucous membrane of the nose and vagina are observed to become denuded of epithelium. Sometimes there is tympanitis. Prostration and collapse follow, the extremities become cold, and death speedily follows."
