For the last few years the great weakness of Jerseys at Toronto, has been lack of competition. Last year low water mark was reached, when only two herds competed. This year there was four. It is rumoured that next year the Duncan herd will again be out. It is to be hoped that this is but the beginning of a revival of the keen competition that once characterized the Jersey classes at Toronto.

One of the most notable of individ-ual exhibits was Sultan's Raleigh, the first prize aged sire exhibited by Bull. He was an easy winner in every way, with great substance, splendid depth, and a wonderfully strong stra back. In the two-year-old class, straight Wm. Mackenzie was first with a bull of good substance and evidences of strong constitution. He was criticiz-ed for being a trifle leggy. His nearof good substance and evidences of strong constitution.
