Northcott, purchasing agent for the city, invites tenders up to 23rd inst. for supply of 150,000 electric light carbons, 1,000 lbs. of flexible cable and a number of arc globes.

ST. JOHN, N.B.—The Dominion Coal Co. will spend \$100,000 in building an immense modern coal handling plant and wharf, plans for which are being prepared by G. Herrick Duggan, the company's engineer at Sydney.—The Intercolonial Railway will spend from \$80,000 to \$100,000 in the erection of a modern round house. Work will be commenced as soon as spring opens.—The Anglo-Canadian Cold Storage Corporation will erect a five storey stone and brick cold storage plant near the C.P.R. terminus at West St. John, to cost \$100,000.—T. McAvity & Sons will erect a new building on Prince William and Water Streets in connection with their brass foundry and install a new plant which will cost in the neighborhood of \$100,000.—The commissioners of the General Public Hospital will ask for tenders for \$25,000 worth of improvements and alterations to their building.—The Union Club will spend about \$10,000 on additions.—A project is on foot for the construction of a pork packing factory by the Matthews Co.

OTTAWA, ONT.—The Roads and Bridges Committee of the County Council have decided to cover several bridges with expanded metal.—A deputation from the City Council last week requested the Dominion Government to build a bridge over the Rideau Canal at Somerset street.—The question of building a new wing to the police station, at an estimated cost of \$10,000, is under consideration by the Council.—The City Engineer has prepared a statement showing that proposed water main extensions this year will cost \$51,000.—Tenders for 75 roller book shelves and 150 long document files will be received by the County Clerk up to noon of 20th inst.—It is probable that a new building will be erected to replace Robinson Primary School.—The erection of a new registry office is under consideration, a committee of the council having been appointed to report on the proposition.—Charles MacNab, clerk Carleton county, desires bids by 4 p.m. of 19th inst. for construction of two masonry abutments for bridge over the Marlborough Creek near Richmond village.—

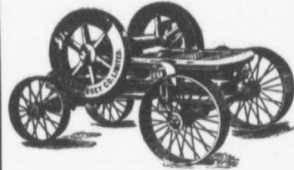
