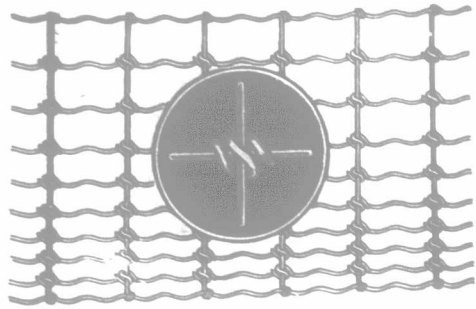

## GOSSIP.

Another large shipment of Clydesdale stallions and mares is shortly to be made from Glasgow to Russia. To one buyer, Messrs. A. & W. Montgomery have sold thirteen stallions and three fillies, and the Seaham Harbour Stud, Ltd., has sold six stallions.

Hume & Co., Menie, Ont., breeders of Ayrshire cattle, in ordering a change of advertisement, write: "The calves we are offering are good ones from heavy-milking dams, and it will pay anyone wanting a dairy bull for next year, or one to head an Ayrshire herd, to write us. He is a breeder of Shorthorns, Oxford sheep and Berkshire pigs. The Shorthorns number 70, all Scotch bred, 23 of which are imported. Pride of Scotland (imp.), bred by Alex. Watson, Aberdeenshire, heads the herd, and to say that the herd is well headed would be putting it mildly. He is a thick-fleshed dark roan, weighing nearly 1,900 lbs. at a little over two years old, in moderate flesh. He is a half-brother to the \$5,000 bull, Lord Banff, from the same dam, and his sire, Clifton, by Prince of Fashion, is a grandson of Champion of England, of the same family as Mr. Duthie's stock bull, Bapton Conqueror. There are fifteen choice calves here from imported dams. They are mostly females from thick-fleshed cows. There are two bull calves dropped last fall, a white and a roan, that are included in the combination sale at Hamilton, June 28th. They should bring good prices. Mr. Rankin is putting nine head into the above mentioned sale, several of which are choice imported cows in calf to Pride of Scotland. Farmers and stockmen from any part of Canada would consult their own interests by inspecting this herd when in want of stock to improve their herds. 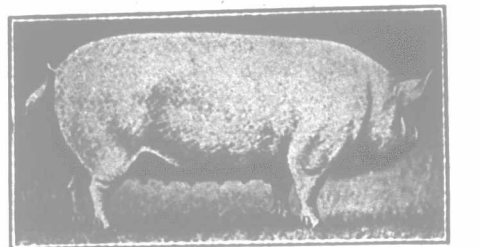
