A Bill to establish the Current Value of Doubloons, was read a second time.

Resolved, That the Bill be committed to a committee of the whole House; and thereupon,

On motion, the House resolved itself into a committee of the whole House, on the consideration of the said Bill accordingly.

Mr. Speaker left the Chair,

Mr. Pyke took the Chair,

Mr. Speaker resumed the Chair.

The Chairman reported from the committee that they had gone through the Bill to them referred, and that the committee had directed him to report the said Bill to the House, without any amendment, and he afterwards delivered the Bill in at the Clerk's Table.

Ordered, That the Bill be engrossed.

On motion, *Ordered*, That the estimate of the expense for the support of the Civil Establishment of Majesty's Government for the year 1814, be referred to the committee of supply; and thereupon,

On motion, the House resolved itself into a committee of the whole House, to consider of a Supply, to be granted for the Support of His Majesty's Government.

Mr. Speaker left the Chair,

Mr. Poole took the Chair,

Mr. Speaker resumed the Chair,

The Chairman reported from the committee that they had made some progress in the business to them referred, and that the committee had directed him to move for leave to sit again, on the consideration of a Supply, which report the House agreed to.

Mr. Shaw, pursuant to leave given, presented a Bill to regulate the Plaister of Paris, or Gypsum Trade; and the same was read a first time.

Resolved, That the Bill be read a second time.

Then the House adjourned until to-morrow, at eleven of the clock.
