As to the two amendments to section forty-two. Because it would be unjust to impose such a Department upon the City Council, seeing that the Corporation has not asked for it in its Petition for amendments to its Act of incorporation, and that the creation of so important a Department ought to be left to be decided upon by the Corporation.

As to the amendments to sub-section four of section forty-two. Because this amend-

ment is a necessary consequence of the two last-mentioned amendments.

And then he withdrew.

The House proceeded to take into consideration the amendment made by the Legislative Council to the Bill, intituled, "An Act to incorporate the Fenelon Falls, Minden, "Haliburton and Northern Lakes Steam Navigation Company," and the same was read as followeth:—

Page 4, line 37—After "may" insert "with the permission of the Commissioner of

"Crown Lands."

The said amendment, being read a second time, was agreed to.

Ordered, That the Clerk do carry back the Bill to the Legislative Council, and acquaint their Honors that this House hath agreed to their amendment.

The Order of the Day for the second reading of the Bill granting to Her Majesty certain sums of money required for defraying certain expenses of the Civil Government for the financial year ending on the thirtieth day of June, 1867, and for other purposes connected with the Public Service, being read;

The Bill was accordingly read a second time; and ordered to be read a third time, on

Monday next.

And it being Five of the Clock in the afternoon, the House was adjourned by Mr. Speaker, until Eleven o'clock, A.M., on Monday next, without a question first put.

Also, the Legislative Council have agreed to the amendments made by this House to the Bill, intituled, "An Act to enable *Hugh Burgess* to obtain a Patent for certain new and "useful improvements."
