At the GENERAL Assembly of this Province of Nova-Scotia, begun and holden at Halifax, on the Fifth Day of December, 1785, in the Twenty Sixth Year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord GEORGE the Third of Great-Britain, France, and Ireland, King, Defender of the Faith, &c. and there continued by several Prorogations unto the Sixth Day of June 1791, in the Thirty First Year of his Majesty's Reign, being the Sixth Session of the Sixth General Assembly, convened in the said Province.

## CAP. I.

AN ACT, to provide for the Support and Maintenance of His Majesty's Government in this Province, by amending and continuing the several Laws, for raising a Revenue, herein after mentioned.

HEREAS it is expedient, that the several Asts of this Province, beforeinaster mentioned, should be continued and amended.

1. Be it therefore Enatted, by the Lieutenant Governor, Council and Affembly, That the Act, made in the Twenty Fourth Year of his present Majesty's Reign, intitled an Act, for more effectually raising a Reventure within this Province, for the support of its Government. Also, an Act, made in the Twenty Fourth Year of his said Majesty's Reign, intitled an Act, for more effectually raising a Duty of Excise on Wine, Rum, and certain other enumerated Articles, and for preventing Frauds in the Collection of the Revenue. Also, an Act, made in the Twenty Sixth Year of his said Majesty's Reign, for continuing, and explaining said Excise Act. Also, an Act, made in the same Twenty Sixth Year of his said Majesty's Reign, to alter, amend, and continue, the said Excise Act. And also, an Act, made in the Twenty Ninth Year of his said Majesty's Reign, intitled an Act, to provide K k k
