XII. And be it further Enacted by the Authority aforefaid, That in all cases in which witnesses shall have duly appeared, to give evidence before to winesses, & such Commissioners, either voluntarily or in obedience to such summons as aforesaid, it shall and may be lawful to and for faid Commissioners, to order and direct the party or parties who shall have produced such witness or witnesses, to pay such witness or witnesses, for his, her, or their loss of time and expences, such sum or sums of money as the said Commissioners in their judgment shall deem equitable and just, which order the party or parties, upon whom the same shall be made, is, and are, and he, she, and they, is and are hereby required and enjoined to obey, and fuch fum or fums of money, shall and may be recovered, and recoverable, under and by the authority of this Act, by action or fuit in any of his Majesty's Courts of justice in this Province, and regard being had to their respective jurisdictions.

Clerk to be appoin ed by the Commillioners.

XIII. And be it further Enacted by the Authority aforefaid, That the faid Commissioners shall have power and authority to employ some fit and proper person as Clerk to the said Commission, and that such Clerk shall be authorized to alk and receive for fetting down, for hearing any claim, and for making up a report of the lame, the lum of five shillings.

Fees allowed to ché Clérk.

For a copy of the order respecting each claim, two shillings and fix-pence.

For every summons signed by one or more Commissioners for the attendance of any witness or witnesses, two shillings and fix pence. For every Commission for the examination of witnesses, twenty shidings.

Act to be real at the General Quarter Sedi-Peace.

'XIV. And be it further Enacted by the Authority aforefaid, That this Act shall be read by the Clerk of the Peace, at the opening of every General Quarter Sessions of the Peace, which shall be held in each and every District of this Province, during the term for which it shall continue to be in force.

Continuance of the Act.

XV. And be it further Enasted by the Authority aforefaid, That this Act shall continue and remain in force until the first day of April in the year of our Lord one thouland eight hundred and eight and no longer.
