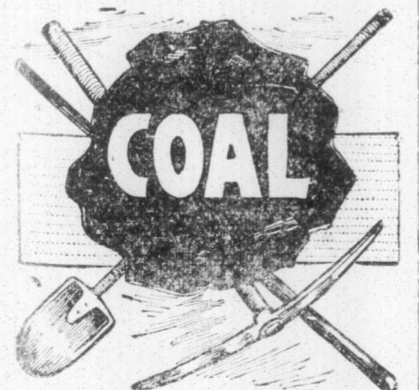

charge of our duty. In view of these circumstances, and also of the necessity of removing temptation so far as possible from our gallant men in khaki who are training for the contest upon which not only our Empire, but our liberty depends, as well as from our about to enlist, the commission has come to the conclusion that the time is now opportune for the curtailment of the hours in which drink may be sold in licensed taverns.

Whereas a state of war now exists in the result of which the British Empire is vitally interested, and whereas it has become apparent, especially during the past few months, that the cost of the war will be enormous, and that in every portion of the Empire it is desirable both in patriotic and other grounds that steps should be taken to reduce within reasonable limits during the period of the war all unnecessary expenditures on the part of the general public.

And whereas the daily consumption of liquor as a beverage is an expense which ought to be modified during the present critical times, and in the opinion of the board it is desirable in order to assist in accomplishing this object that the hours of sale of liquor in the bars and hotels in the province should be reduced.

And whereas, in the opinion of this board it is wise and prudent that by way of experiment every hotel in this province should be closed at the hour of 8 o'clock in the afternoon on every day in the week other than Saturday.

Therefore, be it resolved that, notwithstanding any statutory provision to the contrary, no liquor shall be sold in any licensed tavern in this province upon any day of the week after the hour of 8 o'clock in the afternoon, but this resolution shall not be construed to interfere with the statutory provision respecting the hour of closing on Saturday.

This resolution shall go into effect on Monday, the first day of November next, and shall thereafter continue in full force and effect during the period of the war in which His Majesty's forces are now engaged.
