COMERCIAL UNION
IS ANNOUNCED

Between Austria and Germany—Preferential Tariffs Also Arranged.

By Special Wire to the Courier.

Berne, Nov. 11 (dispatch to The London Morning Post)—"I have learned from Vienna that Germany has succeeded in inducing the Austria Chamber of Commerce at a plenary meeting to agree eventually to all her demands regarding a future economic and commercial union between Austria and Germany. The treaty is to have as long a duration as possible and is to contain a clause providing that the Austro-German commercial policy shall be based on a unified plan, and both countries shall negotiate and conclude in common all commercial treaties with outside states. Preferential tariffs between Austria and Germany are also provided for and these are eventually to pave the way to complete free trade between the two empires.

The two contracting parties have power to add to their number; that is to incorporate other states into the alliance. It is stipulated that Germany and Austria must agree before beginning peace negotiations upon the economic demands they intend to put forward and include Hungary in the Austro-German treaty. The existing agreement between Austria and Hungary is being remodelled.

Were Landed.

London, Nov. 12.—Thirty-eight Lascars and seven Europeans, part of the crew of the British steamship Clan MacAlister, were landed to-day. The Clan MacAlister, a vessel 3,835 tons, was sunk, November 10.

RUSSIANS NEARING PERSIAN CAPITAL

Petrograd, Nov. 12.—According to the latest advices received in Teheran, Persia, according to a despatch from that city, a Russian force is within 45 miles of Teheran, and the indications are that the Germans, Austrians and Turks in that city are preparing to leave, removal of the archives to the German and Austrian Legations, for instance, being in progress.

At a secret session of Parliament, the despatch states, a majority of the deputies expressed the hope that an amicable arrangement of the difficulties between Russia and Persia would be reached. The Cabinet Ministers had been in session for 24 hours, and it is added, trying to formulate conditions acceptable to Russia and Great Britain.

Much excitement is reported in the city, according to the despatch, over the energetic action of the Entente allies, and it is reported that the Shah will retire to Ispahan in the event that the Persian proposals are not acceptable.

By Special Wire to the Courier.
Berlin, Nov. 12.—The difficulties of the army besieging Dvinsk because of the nature of the fortress, which is built of sand, are pictured by Captain Pon Kueschuetzky, correspondent of the Vossische Zeitung. "Had it been of rock," he says, "experts declare it would have been knocked to pieces long ago, but an artillery bombardment is of little avail against a sand fortress. It was captured 12 times between September 15 and October 1, and still is not in the Germans' possession. It has been reduced in size one half without affecting the strength of the remainder.

Every rod of land is covered with permanent trenches, roofed securely against a shrapnel and shell fragments and connected with so-called "fox holes," small shelters where the garrisons are secure against the heaviest shells. Exploding projectiles are smothered in the sand trenches, skillfully laid out so they are mutually outflanking. An apparently successful attack often means the destruction of the assaults by the flanking fire of machine guns, the company thus lost fifty-one dead on October 23."
