CANADIAN NORTHERN AT WORK ON BRANDON-REGINA AIR LINE

AGENTS BUSY PURCHASING RIGHT-OF-WAY THROUGH FARMING SECTIONS TO THE SOUTH-EAST OF THE CITY—PRICES PAID RUN ALL THE WAY FROM \$20 TO \$40 PER ACRE—ACTIVE CONSTRUCTION WORK WILL QUICKLY FOLLOW

Practical evidence of the fact that the Canadian Northern Railway managers do not intend to allow the grass to grow under their feet but mean business in regard to the early construction of their air line to Regina, came in direct communication with Winnipeg and the Great Lakes region, in the fact that the agents of the company are at present busily engaged in purchasing a right-of-way for the line from the Manitoba and westward, Mr. Johnson, of the "Appelle," who is acting for the company in securing the right-of-way for the line at this western end, has during the past few days cleared out a large number of farmers both east and west of Pilot Butte for a right-of-way through their respective farms. The prices paid by Mr. Johnson vary from \$20 to \$40 per acre. With only a few exceptions, the right-of-way clear through to Regina has now been obtained, the farmers with few exceptions welcoming the road heartily and readily meeting it in regard to the terms of purchase.

This action by the C.N.R. is the forerunner of active construction work, it already having been decided by Vice President D. D. Mann that the new line would be ready to haul out this year's crop.

It is further stated that the C.N.R. is further realizing the full benefit of its acquisition of the Regina-Prince Albert line until it has a line to the east from Regina, and a line to the west from Regina, with the completion of the Brandon-Regina air line at three o'clock in the morning and the terminal and at its centre at Wapman.

COAL COMMISSION HEARS EVIDENCE

GALT MINER CRITICIZES WAGE SYSTEM—FEW FATAL ACCIDENTS

LETHBRIDGE, May 29.—The Coal Commission heard the evidence of miners employed in the Galt mines here today.

All the questioning was done by the Commission, and the witnesses were allowed to offer all the suggestions they desired. The first witness was John McTaggart, an employee of the Galt mines for twelve years. He seemed to be generally satisfied with the conditions in the mines, though he declared the ventilation was none too good.

He had had twenty years' experience as a miner and had worked in England, India and Africa.
