



### "HER' 'BALLOT.

"HER' 'BALLOT.

It is an almost forgotten fact that the first Constitution of New Jersey adopted in 1779, provided explicitly for weman suffrage. "All inhabitants of this Colony of full age, who are worth fifty pounds proclamation money, clear estate in the same, and have resided within the county in which they dain a vote for twelve menths immediately preceding the election, shall be entitled to vote for Representatives in Council and Assembly and also for all other public officers that shall be elected by the prople of the country at large."

That this was no string-tied grant of the ballot, that "all inhabitants" meant ALL inhabitants and not merely all male inhabitants otherwise qualified, is proved by the equally forgotten fact that under the foregoing constitutional warrant the New Jersey Legislature passed an act regulating elections and actually constitutional warrant the New Jersey Legislature passed an act regulating elections and actually constitutional warrant the New Jersey Legislature passed an act regulating elections and actually constitutions. "Every voter shall openly and in full view deposit shis or HER ballot, which shall be a single written ticket containing the names of the person for whom he or she votes."
