

THOUSANDS OF CANADIANS RETURN

Exodus From U. S. Heavy During First Half of Fiscal Year

OTTAWA, Oct. 21.—Canadians to the number of 27,486 returned to Canada from the United States during the first half of the present fiscal year, according to Immigration Department figures.

Of this number 23,141 were Canadian born citizens, 2,632 were British subjects who had acquired domicile in Canada and later moved to the United States, and 1,713 were naturalized Canadian citizens.

The statement of the Department shows a falling off of ten per cent. in immigration from all countries to Canada during the first half of the present fiscal year, as compared with the same period a year ago. Total immigration

up to September 30 of the present year was 85,212 persons from all countries. Immigrants came from Great Britain to the number of 42,788; from United States—10,155 and from other countries 32,269.

During the first half of the fiscal year 1923-24, total immigration was 94,333, divided as follows:—British, 51,961; United States, 13,055; other countries, 29,317.

"Music is a comparatively young art," says Prof. Dykema. "Practically everything that we have in the

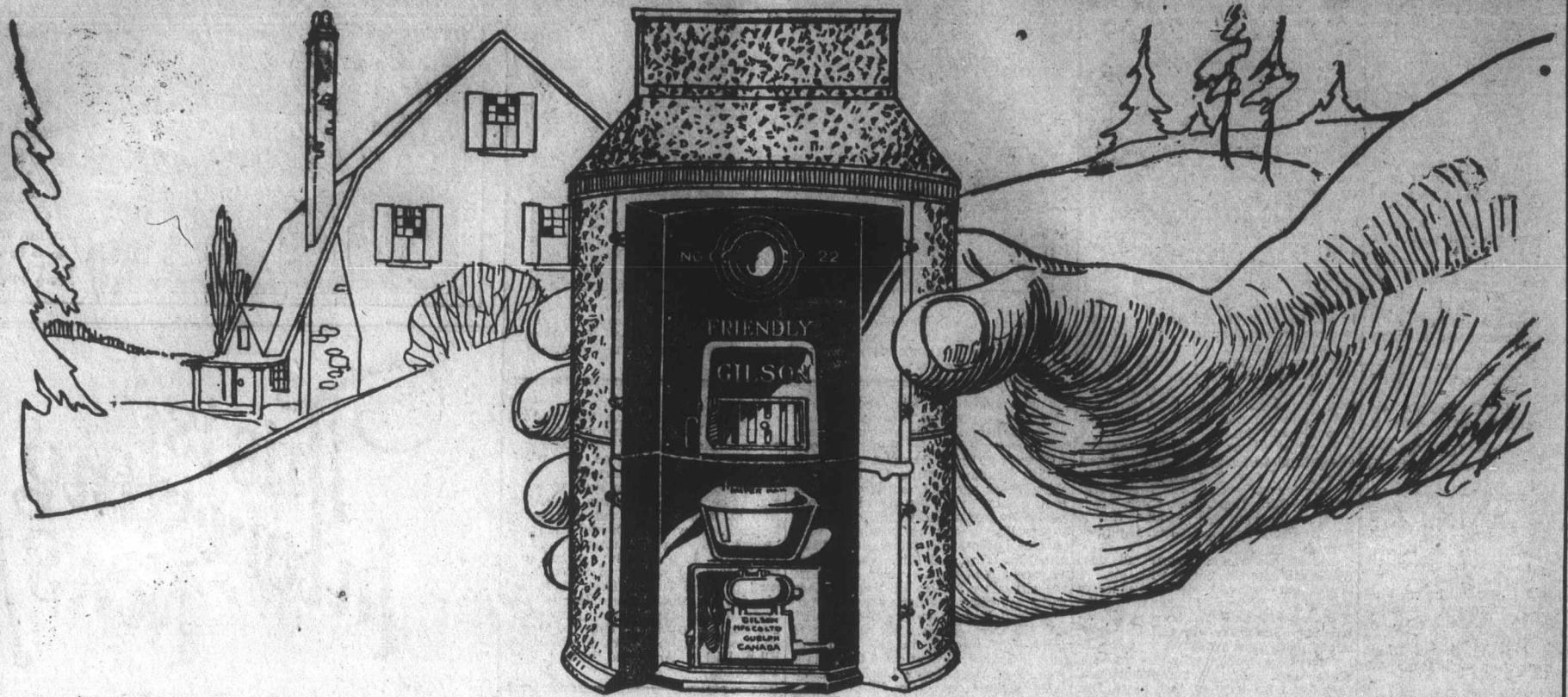
remarkable development of modern music has come into being within the last 400 years. Music was just starting when painting had reached a stage which has probably not since been surpassed."
