The Hon. Mr. McKeown, in the ourse of a fine address at the Liberal convention in St. John last Thursday evening, gave several reasons why the working men should support the Government in the coming contest. The government passed the Mechanics' Lien Act, whereby every machinist, mechanic, builder or Lien Act, laborer who does work or furnishes material used in any building shall have a lien for the price of the work or the materials upon the land or buildings. They also passed an Act whereby wage claims given are priority over all other debts where an ssignment is made for the benefit of the creditors.

Another piece of useful legislation was the passing of the Woodmen's Lien Act. whereby any person who performs any labor or service upon logs or lumber shall have a lien on

the logs for his pay.

Mr. McKeown also pointed out that some years ago workmen injured in this employment found great difficulty in getting compensation, but the Government stepped in again in the interest of the workingmen and passed An Act for compensation for injuries to workmen, whereby any sation from his employer, notwithstanding under the common law he might be liable.

But, better than this, said Mr. McKeown, the Government believed in seeing that wage earners were protected in their employment, and so passed the Factories Act, which provides for the inspection of factories so that injuries and accidents may be avoided. An inspector makes his rounds and sees to it that dangerous places where warkmen may be injured are properly protected.
