

London, April 29.- Operations against the Mad Mullah are about to begin, if they have not already begun, in British Somaliland. It will be recollected that the White Paper which was last issued on the subject brought up events to the end of February, when the For-eign Office announced that they were sending out the requirements which were urgently asked for by Colonel Swayne. Since then the Mad Mullah has assumed the aggressive, and has ser-ously threatened the British position, so much so that troops have been sent from Aden to Berberah. UNDERMINED BY THE RAINS: Toronto, April 30.-A strange acci-dent happened last night shortly af-ter six o'clock, which recails in all their horror the terrible crimes of Holmes, the multi-murderer from Chicago, who did away with the two little Pletzel girls at the house, 16 St. Vincent street, and afterwardy buried their bodies in a small cellar under the rear part of the house. The accident was the collapse of the house while standing on props dur-ing the operation of building a cel-lar under it. Ever after the atrocities commit-ted on the St. Vincent street resi-dence, which is a roughcast cottage one and one-half storles high, were brought to light, it was a very dif-ficult matter to find tenants for the place. Latterly, however, it has been occupied by Mr. Harry White, a shipper employed by the Ozone company. The kitchen stove broke through the floor, the plazo was wrecked, all the walls and partitions were demolish-ed or splintered, and the structure was practically destroyad. 


