

DELAREY'S COMMANDOES

Will Discuss Peace Terms Some Time Next Week.

RECRUITS LEAVE FOR HALIFAX.

London, April 29.—A detachment to the Daily Telegraph from Johannesburg, dated Saturday, says that Gen. Delarey's commandoes, under Commandant Kemp, will meet early next week to discuss the question of peace.

Captured by Boers.

Ottawa, April 29.—According to a letter received to-day, Dr. Harry Jackson, formerly a dentist on Sparks street, was captured by the Boers on March 27. The Canadian troops took part in a drive near Klerksdorp and rounded up a number of guns and killed a few Boers. Dr. Jackson, however, fell into the hands of the enemy. The writer thought that the prisoner would be returned to the British lines in a few days. Dr. Jackson went out as a private. He is a son of Mr. James Jackson, 69 Victoria street.

Recruits at Halifax.

Halifax, April 28.—The military camp at Willow Park is now a scene of great activity. The work of organizing is steadily progressing, and preparations are being made for the 3rd Regiment, which will sail first. The clothing for the men of this regiment has all been served out, and to-day the troopers of the 9th Regiment were receiving their kit. A number of horses arrived to-day, and were taken to the stables at the camp. The 3rd Regiment is now complete and ready to go on the troopship. It is likely that by noon of the 4th Regiment, in which the Halifax men are, will leave with the 3rd Regiment on the Centurion.

British Columbia Men.

Vancouver, April 28.—Seventy-five men, composing Vancouver, Victoria and New Westminster contingents to the fourth Canadian contingent, left on route for Halifax to-day. C. P. R. express. Lieut. Worshop, who has received a commission, went in charge of the detachment. He is a son of Colonel Worshop, commanding the local militia.

From the North.

Sault Ste. Marie, April 29.—Twenty-five men left here for Halifax to go to South Africa with the fourth contingent. There were a number of people at the C. P. R. station to see them off, and there was great cheering as the train pulled out. They were escorted by the 7th Regiment, and by the regimental band, the Boys' Brigade, and hundreds of citizens. FROM FAR BAROTSELAND.

Negro King is Coming to the Coronation of King Edward.

London, April 30.—Reuter's Agency learns that Col. Colin Harding, C. M. G., late Acting Administrator of North-west Rhodesia, leaves for London to-day to meet King Lewanika, the paramount chief of Barotse, and escort him to England, where he is coming at the invitation of the King, to be present at the coronation. King Lewanika has placed the whole of his empire, which is much larger than Germany, under British protection, and this is administered by the British South Africa Company.

He travels chiefly in his state barge, which is propelled by 80 rowers, most of whom are Indians, and all attired in tiger skins round the loins, and lions manes on their heads. Even the Prime Minister, who wears European clothes, has to take off these garments, and putting on his native skin take his turn at the oars. The King himself is seated under a canopy, which is surmounted by gigantic stuffed figures of elephants and giraffes, usually manufactured by Lewanika himself, of calico and cane.

MAD MULLAH AGGRESSIVE.

Operations Beginning in British Somaliland.

London, April 29.—Operations against the Mad Mullah are about to begin, if they have not already begun, in British Somaliland.

It was recalled that the White Paper which was last issued on the subject brought up events to the end of February, when the Foreign Office announced that they were sending out the requirements which were urgently asked for by Colonel Swynn.

Since then the Mad Mullah has assumed the aggressive, and has seriously threatened the British position, so much so that troops have been sent from Aden to Berberah.

There is no doubt that some sharp fighting is imminent.

SHOOTING WAS ACCIDENTAL.

Jury Acquits School-boy of Any Intention.

Kingston, Ont., April 29.—The Coroner's jury empaneled to enquire into the circumstances of the shooting of little Laurence Holland by his schoolmate in the cloak-room of the Frontenac school, to-night brought in a verdict of accidental homicide. They believed that the boy was not aware that the revolver was loaded. The jury called attention to the numerous second-hand stores in the city, and advised the closer inspection and licensing of them, and also to extend the law as to the sale of the weapons, and that the carrying of them be more strictly enforced. The matter is now in the hands of the county attorney.

LAW TOO LAXLY ENFORCED.

The judge in the case of the boy who shot the little girl had knocked off his hat, drew the revolver and shot her without saying a word. One witness said that he did say once to Beatrice "Give me my hat," but this was a moment or so before he fired the shot. All agreed Beatrice never spoke after the bullet pierced her brain. Evidence by several boys who had seen the matter constantly; many did not know it was loaded. He asked if he had hit the wall, but when told he had shot Beatrice he fled. The children generally said he was popular. The teacher said he was a boy of high spirits, and consequently quite troublesome. He was a reader of pernicious literature, and she had to take from him several "Jesse James" novels.

CONTRACTORS AT WAR.

Canadians Fortify Themselves on St. Lawrence Island.

Ogdensburg, N. Y., April 29.—Canadian contractors who are in dispute with the British contractors for building the summer school at Float Island, in the St. Lawrence River, have seized the island and possession. Last fall the Rev. Dr. Ullman, rector of Trinity School, New York City, purchased the island and granted certain contracts to Canadian builders, who began the work at once. Subsequently contracts were given to Brockville builders, who commenced work where the Canadian men stopped. The latter learning of the fact appeared with a force of workmen. They tore down the work being done, drove off the Brockville men, and placed a guard on the island to prevent them from again landing on it. The courts have granted an ad interim injunction, the writ being returnable on May 6th, and the latter learning of the fact decided who has the right to erect the buildings.

SELF-MADE ITALIANS.

Rome, April 30.—The Government has recently decorated six self-made men with the new order of "Knights of Labor." One is manager of a big Turin shirt factory, Signor Boero, who began as a simple workman, earning less than ten francs a week, and built up a tremendous business, employing thousands of hands.
