Between 4 and 4.30 o'clock as Mr ook and sons were getting out of ed to start to work on the farm they were astonished to find the barn which is not any more than fifty yards from the dwelling house n flames. The Cook family then began to fight the blaze, meanwhile Mr. Edward Coaker noticed from his farm the flames. Mr. Coaker hurried to Mount Cashel and got a Christian nent. The Central men went in with the chemical but when they arrived the fire was beyond control and the barn with its contents was burnt to the ground. According to the firemen all that saved Mr. Cook's dwelling house from igniting was the fact that it was covered with tin sheet. The property destroyed included barn, 16 cows, 4 horses, a large quantity of seeded potatoes and feeds of various sorts together with an exensive outfit of farm implements endered useless, all valued at about \$5,500 upon which only \$700 insurance was carried.




