Sloan-Duployan Shorthand Competitions
MANY NEWFOUNDLAND SUCCESSORS.

Class IV. (200 words per minute)—Gold Medal to S. Venkataraman, B.A., Official Reporter, High Court of Judicature, Madras, India.

New Zealand Sheep
CORRIEDALES TO BE SEEN AT WEMBLEY.

Farmers and animal lovers generally will be interested to learn that a number of Corriedale sheep from New Zealand will shortly be on view at Wembley.

A year ago New Zealand breeders were anxious to send some of their sheep for display at the first British Empire Exhibition, but owing to the quarantine restrictions the matter was allowed to drop.

At this year's Exhibition, however, Merinos from Australia, three from each of four States, are being exhibited, and it was felt that a supreme effort should be made to send some of New Zealand's sheep, particularly some of the famous Corriedale breed, as this breed is entirely of New Zealand origin, and in addition to its popularity in New Zealand, no breed has done more to advertise abroad the resources of the Dominion as one of the foremost countries in the world for the production of livestock.

Through the close co-operation of the Department of Industries and the Commerce and the originators of the enterprise, Messrs. Abraham and Williams, this has been arranged, and the sheep will soon be released from quarantine. The selection consists of two one-shear stud rams and four ewe hoggets, bred by Mr. H. T. Little, of Hul Hul, Woodgrove, North Canterbury.

Although the sheep are only in half wool, their fleeces are of exceptional quality, and all of them show splendid mutton qualities.

The flock from which the sheep were selected was founded twenty-five years ago with sheep from the flock of the late Mr. James Little, the originator of the Corriedale breed.

The Corriedale Breeders' Society has forwarded to Wembley a large supply of pamphlets dealing with the origin and history of the breed, and these will be distributed to farmers and others interested in the sheep.

It is intended to keep the Corriedales on exhibition until September, when they will be sold at public auction.
