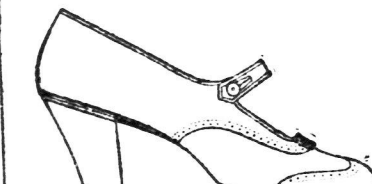

PRINT SCHOOL

TAX IN RED INK

New Scheme to Impress Upon the People What It Costs for Education in London.

ALD. RICHTER'S IDEA

Taxpayers Will Be Told in Dollars and Cents Just How Much They Pay for Each Civic Branch of Work.

The tax slip this year will be much more comprehensive than in the past. It will contain every item of expenditure that goes to make up the tax rate—general rate, school rate, debt rate, etc., and will not be given in terms of mills on the dollar, but in actual dollars and cents.

This will make it very plain exactly how much every man is paying for the education of his children, for street improvements, for debt service, both local improvement and ordinary, and all the rest of it.

The school tax will be separated as in Toronto, and will probably be printed in red ink. It was the intention to collect the school rate as one of the instalments, but this would involve much more labor and consequently more expense, and it was decided to collect the taxes as at present. However, the school rate will be sufficiently placarded to allow the taxpayer to know exactly what it is costing him.

This, Ald. Richter figures out, will lead the citizens to take a deeper interest in educational matters, especially in the line of expenditure.

This information will be given, and opposite each item will be placed in actual figures the actual amount of money the figures represent. The tax slip will be two columns larger.

"The new slip will be very satisfactory," said Tax Collector Hayes. "It will not interfere with our method of collecting the instalments, but will give every taxpayer exact information as to what he is paying his money for."

58 NEW MEMBERS DURING THE YEAR

Talbot Street Baptist Church Is Flourishing in All Branches of Work.

OFFICERS WERE CHOSEN

Committees Also Named—Membership at Present Is 717—Some Families Have Left the Congregation.

The annual meeting of the congregation of the Talbot Street Baptist Church was held last night, and reports received from the various departments indicate that the year just past has been a most flourishing one, and that the church is growing steadily in every way.

The membership at the present time is 717. During the year there were 58 new members and 71 were lost through moving away and other reasons, making a decrease of 13.

The total amount given for missions was \$2,054.30, and the total receipts from all branches was \$8,638.56. Of this sum \$6,783.69 was contributed from the church directly, and the following amounts were received from societies:

Ladies' Aid \$605.07, Young Ladies' Mission Auxiliary \$84.23, Sunday school \$385.77, Women's Mission Circle \$25.17, Northwest Indian Mission \$13.34, home missions \$240.02, foreign missions \$199.39, B. Y. P. Union \$59.62.

The Ladies' Aid also raised the interest on the church mortgage.

During the year the relief committee distributed \$75.79 among the poor. The treasurer's report showed that the receipts increased \$251.68, and that there was a balance on hand of \$389.12.
