DON'T BE WEAK ENOUGH TO USE A FLOATER.

I'M GOING TO GET OVER THAT HAZARD VERY EASILY

TRY A LITTLE "COUE" IN YOUR GOLF. YOU'LL FIND IT HELPS

Is it a good policy to carry both light and heavy balls, or should a round of golf be played throughout with the same kind of ball?

Answered by BOB MACDONALD, Winner of the Metropolitan Open championship, 1921 and 1923. One of the longest drivers in the game, though using only a 12½ ounce driver.

Always use the same kind of ball. All hazards, including water, are chiefly mental. In most cases the shot would be a very easy one if the hazard were invisible. To use a floater is to give in to a weakness in the game. So I say, use one weight of ball, put a little "coué" into the shot, and then step up and make the shot you wish to make.

## U. S. OLYMPIC STARS SAIL FOR EUROPE

All Branches of Sport Represented in Body of 253 Who Left Today.

New York, June 16.—The main body of United States Olympic athletes, 253 strong, sailed on the specially chartered steamer America today at noon.

Track and field stars comprise 105 of the total aggregation which will wear the United States colors in eight branches of competition. Supplementing the track team are 11 gymnasts, 26 boxers, 17 wrestlers, 36 men and 24 women swimmers, 7 cyclists, 17 fencers and 19 equestrians.

The Yale eight, which has won the right to represent the United States in the Olympics, will sail Saturday on the Homeric.
