# FREEDOM IN RUHR IS GERMANS' WISH

President Voices Bitter Disappointment Over Action of Allies.

PROGRESS IN 1924

Associated Press Despatch Berlin, Jan, 1 .- The German valedictories to 1924 and the greetings o the incoming year are largely colored by the ill-feeling over the prospective failure of the allies to evacuate the Cologne area on Jan. 10 as forecast from Paris. While the retrospective views expressed concede that the past year has been one of economic and social progress, the new year prophets are none too sanguine over the immediate outlook for the continued improvement of the nation's internal affairs and its foreign relations.

"The year just closed has been one of conspicuous and progressive convalescence and internal consolida ion for our sorely-tried fatherland, n that our currency, our state finance and our economic life have been liberated from the vicious manifestations and effects of the inflation period and given more secure foundations." President Ebert told a delegation of government leaders, headed by Chancellor Marx, on the occasion of its new year visit to the executive mansion today.

President Ebert said he believed thanks were due Chancellor Marx and his associates in the cabinet for the progress that had been achieved, and he declared Germany owed it to the government's energy and nerthe government's energy and per-severance in the face of heavy odds that a tangible step forward had been made.

Discussing the subject of the evacuation of the Rhineland, the president continued: "Whatever their political faith, the Germans everywhere are today one in their feeling of bitter disappointment and their consciousness of a new and painful injustice. Under pretexts, with which we are as yet unfamiliar and which we therefore are unable to examine, but of the inconsistencies of which we are all convinced, we are to be deprived of the sole advantage vouchsafed us in an immeasurably oppressive peace treaty—the evacuation of occupied German soil."

This condition, President Ebert observed, was all the more intolerable because Germany was the only truly disarmed nation in a Europe bristlin with armaments.


