members of the firm, and Samuel
Kirstbaum, a clerk, and escaped with
more than \$2,000 worth of choice
beaver skins.

front of a pistol. In a minute and a

feld walked into the store.

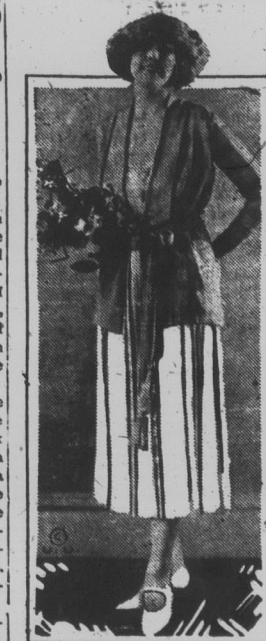
The senior partner had hardly real-
