

Counterfeiter McTiernan's Defence. The defence set up by Ambrose Mc4 Tiernan at the Sessions yesterday on the charge of issuing counterfeit money was that the moulds and coins found in his possession had been left in his care on the day of his arrest by a man named George Patterson, whose ac-quaintance he had formed in Rochester, N.Y.
