## University Seeks Practice Game Here On Saturday

Petrolia Hard Oils May Be Secured; Western Has Squad of Smart Young Players Who Make Fine Progress Under Fickley's Methods; London A.A.A. V. Western To-Morrow; Collegiate Awaits Schedule

More than enough players to line up for two teams greeted Coach Fickley, of the University of Western Ontario, yesterday, and a big afternoon's work on the gridiron was indulged in.

Fickley has very few of last year's players in hand, but he is fortunate in being able to handle boys who are graduates from secondary schools, where the autumnal pastime is their chief athletic endeavor. Over 30 players are being drilled in the Hamilton "tiger" fashion, as Fickley is an ex-tiger, and his efforts are bound to show remarkable results. The university students are undoubtedly going to make the best showing yet in the intercollegiate series, since this college was entered in the same series with University of Toronto, St. Michael's College and Guelph, Ontario, Aggies.

The material at Fickley's disposal is more than usually turned out at Western, but the latter, hard-working boys are most attentive and willing in their practices.

Director Dr. Smith is angling for an exhibition game here on Saturday afternoon with the Petrolia Hard Oils, and in communication with President Earl Smith, of the Petrolia team.

The playing of games is the best sort of practice, contends Coach Fickley, and putting into practice what has been taught will fit the squad for their scheduled fixtures.

To-morrow evening the University will play the London A. A. A. intermediates in a practice workout at Tecumseh Park. Both teams will benefit by the experience gained.

The London A. A. A. crew, later each day with their practice hours, are getting down to hard work these days, but the fact that a majority of them are retained by their various business pursuits retards the sort of progress that Manager Friend and Coach Hustus would prefer.

Their best game, however, was at Sarnia last Saturday, while Western does not play Varsity at Toronto until one week later.

Ship Epinaro To Latonia Tomorrow

French Turf Star Will Meet Larkin and Wise Counsellor At 1 1/4 Miles October 11

NEW YORK, Sept. 29.—Larkin, winner of the International Special at Aqueduct on Saturday, Epinaro, a colt which he beat by a nose, and Wise Counsellor, which finished third in the race, will be shipped on Wednesday to Latonia to take part in the third race of the season on October 11.

It is doubtful, however, that Zev will be shipped this week, but the Steeplechase, which will run on Saturday, will be a starter at Latonia as will be the play, which will carry the colors of the Lexington stable.

Interest in the third race of the series has been greatly increased as a result of the race on Saturday. Epinaro's victory is regarded as the French champion and his chances to win the final race of the series and especially since the third and final race is over a distance of a mile and one quarter.

It was generally conceded that at the finish on Saturday Epinaro was going fast enough to have beaten Larkin in another stride or two. However, Clarence Kummer, who rode Epinaro, declares that Larkin ran a race that was not apparent on the surface.

Kummer says that Larkin ran badly for the first quarter of a mile, got his feet tangled up and did not get started right. Kummer, who undoubtedly outran Epinaro and O'Donnell, who took Larkin on the outside, then shot inside behind Epinaro and ran him practically out of the race and still has enough left to withstand the terrific challenge that Epinaro made in the last 50 yards.

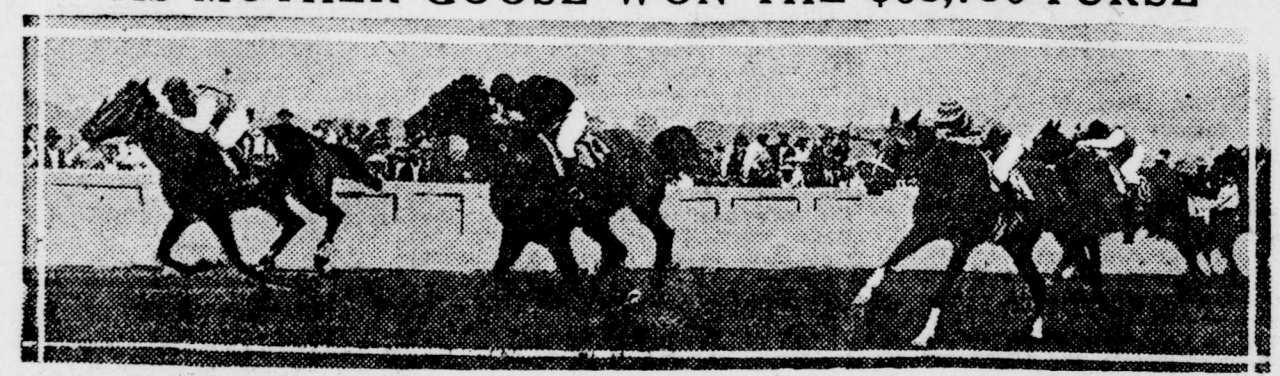
