SUMMER SCHOOL.
Teachers Desiring Special Study in Science May Hereafter go to Guelph.

Hon. Dr. Pyne, Minister of Education, has under consideration the advisability of omitting this year the summer schools held for Public School teachers in the various Normal Schools, in view of the special summer schools to be held for Separate School teachers. President G. C. Creelman, of the Guelph Agricultural College, has suggested to the Minister that the summer school for nature study and natural science at the college be utilized by all the teachers of the Province who desire to take such a course, and it is probable the suggestion will be acted upon. The tendency in this work is towards smaller classes. It is not probable that the summer schools will be permanently abolished, but it is expected important changes will be made in them next year, with a view to giving them a greater practical value.
