During 1920 so much more tea was produced than was required throughout the World that the market dropped to a comparatively low point. So serious was the position of the growers in India, Ceylon and Java that they agreed to produce 20% less tea during 1921. The result was that less tea was produced than was required, and now all surplus stocks have pretty well been exhausted to fill the deficiency. Prices in the last four months have steadily advanced, until the market to-day is at a level as high as was ever before reached even during war years.

**LAMBTON BASEBALL LEAGUE ORGANIZED**

Petrolia, April 29.—Six teams will face the Lambton County Baseball League barrier this year when the season opens on May 24th. At a well attended meeting of the league held here last night Cloyd Hale, president of the Enarcos, 1921 champions, was elected president of the league for the coming year, and R. P. Brown, of Watford, secretary-treasurer.

Waubuno's application was received and accepted, making the circuit a six-team affair. Petrolia, Forest, Brigden, Watford and Oil Springs are back again.

Each team will play 20 games, 10 at home and 10 on the road. This is a larger allotment of games than last season. The schedule is given in another column.

The Petrolia team that won the championship last season is practically intact, with first and third base the only positions causing any concern.

**EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE**  
Composed of one member from Each Club

**RULES AND REGULATIONS**

1. The admission for each club will be \$5.00 and if found insufficient to run the expenses of the league each club can be called upon by the committee for another donation, limited to \$5.00.
  2. Each club shall place in the Secretary's hands a marked cheque for \$50.00 as a guarantee for each club to finish the schedule to be returned at the end of the playing year if not forfeited.
  3. Unless they can give a satisfactory excuse to the Executive, each team defaulting a game must give 24 hours' notice to the opposing team and will also forfeit \$20.00 to be paid before the next game to the treasurer of the opposing team.
  4. Each club shall have 48 hours to protest after a game, the protest to be made in writing to the Secretary.
  5. Each player shall be a bona-fide resident, within a radius of 7 miles and will play with the nearest club to him (students shall be considered bona-fide residents).
  6. Each club shall prepare a list of players, their names to be given to the Secretary by the 15th May, 1922, any additional players after that date must have the permission of the Executive to play.
  7. Each team will provide an umpire. The visiting umpire is to be the umpire in chief and officiate behind the batter. The umpire in chief has the power to suspend any player for the remainder of the game. The home team is responsible for the protection of the umpire.
  8. No player shall be allowed to play on more than one team during the season. He must finish the season on the team with which he starts.
  9. The Secretary of the League will furnish the secretary of each club with the list of players of each club.
  10. Any club wishing to add players must have the permission of the Executive. The secretary will then notify each club. They will not be eligible to play until he does so.
  11. Any team that has not been notified of added players may protest the game in which the players in question took part.
  12. A regular executive meeting shall consist of the secretary and one other official and 75% of the Club's representatives.
  13. In case of a deadlock an outside arbitrator will be appointed by the President.




