THE ROSS GOVERNMENT'S DILEMMA.

The government that needs the
sanctions of a corrupt political
machine to maintain itself in power
is far gone and reckless of conse-
quences. Such a line is the Ross Ad-
ministration in this province. It ob-
tained a new lease of power on a
very narrow margin and only did so
by a free resort to corruption and
rascality. To hold what it had,
greater election crimes were com-
mitted in its name in the by-elec-
tions and the legal machinery of the
province was made to serve the Gov-
ernment's ends in affording protection
to its minions. The government has
found itself in the position of the man
who tells a falsehood and not wish-
ing to admit it; tells more falsehoods
to cover up the first one. Once start-
ed on the downward course, the min-
istry has gone quickly from bad to
worse until to-day, it stands discredit-
ed and disgraced even in the eyes
of many who have been its warmest
supporters.

A convincing proof of the govern-
ment's weakness was shown recently
when Premier Ross used his influence
at Ottawa and had the Laurier
Government offer Mr. J. J. Foy, Q.C.,
M.P., a High Court judgeship. Mr.
Foy is a lawyer who is a conspicuous
figure in the legal and high character
and had been chosen to accept the pro-
posed position, would have made an
able judge and the appointment
would have been a meritorious one
which is rarely the case now-a-days
when activity in politics cuts more
of a figure with the Dominion gov-
ernment than ability does.

Mr. Foy would have been an able
judge, but the most surprising part
of the offer was that the Minister

proffered the position to a Conser-
vative, who is one of Mr. Whitney's
lieutenants and most trusted officers.

It was a "slim" political move on
the part of Mr. Ross. Had he been
able in that manner to dispose of a
formidable opponent, he would have
gained some credit for the move
among his own following, who would
not stop to ask why he should want
to rid the Legislature of Mr. Foy.

The Greeks came bearing gifts but
Mr. Foy has declined them. To a
moderate man the temptation of a
judgeship would have been irresisti-
ble. In saying No, Mr. Foy has pro-
ved himself to be a man of principle
and one who is not in public life
looking for political applause.

If Mr. Ross and his colleagues were
not weak and outclassed in the House
they would not require to attempt
to eliminate men, that stand in fear
of, by a species of bribery.

HOPE DOMINATED BY FEAR.

London, July 6.-2.30 a.m.-The story
that all foreigners in Peking were un-
